

BIG-AIR BUGGY COMPETITION RULES

All riders will be required to wear a safety helmet, this is NOT optional.

The arena – this will be an area 150m² which will be clearly marked.

Competitors must be inside the arena boundary when executing their jump (taking off). If, in the event a jump is executed within the arena but is landed out-side the arena, the jump will count and be judged as complete.

All riders must adhere to the timetable, and must attend all meetings for all rounds in which they are competing.

Competitors must be air-bourn before any points can be awarded; NO AIR = NO POINTS!

The judges decision will be final.

RIDERS RESPONSIBILITY

For all riders, protection wear and/or body armour is advised but will be the choice of the individual.

All riders are responsible for assessing their own capabilities, and will make their own decision on competing and whether to start, or remain in the competition. Under 16's will need parental permission.

Riders who are choosing to permanently attach themselves to buggy; competitors must ensure restraints are to an appropriate standard, release/safety catches must be clearly visible and can be easily released in case of an emergency. The style, design or type is down to individual riders choice. Riders will not be permitted to secure themselves with a rope.

Ramps will be available for use within the competition arena, riders must not attempt to try anything which is above the individuals capabilities.

Each rider is personally liable for any damage to property or injury to a third party, which arises out of their equipment or their actions.

Riders must not enter the competition area, when not competing. If they do so they will receive one warning. A second infringement may result in the rider being disqualified from the competition.

All rider's will perform as individuals, when competing in the arena riders may only accept help from the arena marshalls or their fellow competitors. If marshall assistance is required riders should raise their hand clearly if help is not obviously required.

At the end of each round, it is the competitors responsibility to check the board, and be aware of their position in the competition, and be available accordingly.

All riders must show good sportsmanship at all times. Any rider seen showing threatening or abusive behaviour may result in disqualification. During the competition, competitors, marshalls and judges must not be disturbed when a round is taking place. Any queries competitor's may have, must be clearly stated to an arena marshall at either the start or the end of a round, not during. This will be relayed to the judges and dealt with accordingly.

Clothing and branding – please feel free to take this opportunity to wear relevent clothing for your sponsors or club, this will show in the filming and photography.
